



UD Soccer Coach, David Hoffmann, Earns 100th Win

The University of Dallas would like to congratulate men's soccer coach David Hoffmann on his 100th career win as a collegiate coach. The milestone victory came in a 4-0 shutout over Dallas Christian College in Farmers Branch, TX on October 21. With the win, he has recorded 67 victories throughout the course of 5 seasons and 11 games of the 2008 campaign. The victory takes their 2008 record to 11-3-1 and pushes his coaching record to 67-29-6 in his five plus seasons. Prior to his arrival at the University of Dallas in 2003, Hoffmann recorded 33 wins at Schreiner University in Kerrville, TX.

Since his tenure started as the University of Dallas head soccer coach following the 2002 season, Hoffmann has seen a great rise in soccer participation through his tireless efforts as a recruiter and attention to detail on the field. His best season to date at UD occurred last year as his team went 17-1-1. The team helped him set new school records in winning percentage at .921, and wins in a season at 17.

The Colleyville, TX native has been involved in soccer either as a player or a coach for thirty one years dating back to 1977. As a player, Hoffman started all four years at St. Mary's University and served as the team captain his senior year after playing high school ball at Grapevine H.S. After completing his college eligibility, he spent several years playing semi pro for the South Texas Eagles, Fort Worth United, and N.E.T. Longhorns.

Coach Hoffman is married to Tricia Hoffmann, and the couple has a 3 ½ year old daughter named Trinity. Hoffmann and his family reside in Highland Village.
